#### The Founders of Houndslake – The Early Beginnings







The founders of Houndslake were Robert E. "Bob" Penland and Dorsey K. Lybrand. Bob was born and reared in Columbia, South Carolina and graduated from "Carolina" Law School in 1940. He went to work for J. Edgar Hoover as a Special Agent in the FBI.

After serving 11 years in "The Bureau" in our nation's capital, New York City, Cleveland, and back to DC, Bob picked up the Washington Post one morning and read the headlines, "AEC (now DOE) Announces the Largest Peace Time Plant in the History of the US near Aiken South Carolina". Bob was familiar with Aiken as a "sleepy, little, winter town", and he knew this area was certainly not ready for what was about to happen. As a result of this news (and because he missed South Carolina) Bob resigned from the FBI and moved to Aiken in 1951. He checked into the Henderson Hotel (now Aiken's new Municipal Building). He focused his energy on providing much needed residential development. Because of the construction of the Savannah River Plant there were 35,000 people coming to Aiken and housing was not available.

He began by purchasing 5 acres of land and the end of Berrie Road, now Fermata Place. After that his developments included Dunbarton Oaks and Elmwood Park.

Dorsey Lybrand served our country in the US Navy during World War II. His ship was torpedoed in the Atlantic and he spent 32 days in a life raft. He then became a prominent attorney in Aiken whose partners included Sen. Strom Thurmond, Charles Simons Jr., Arthur Rich and Marshall Cain. Dorsey also served in the state senate for 2 terms.

In 1956, Bob married Amelia Knoedler, a journalist, who was recruited to Aiken to open the first Aiken office of the Augusta Chronicle. Their daughter, "Peggy", was born in 1957. One Saturday in 1961, the activities this energetic three-year-old caused Bob to escape to Palmetto Golf Club for some peace and quiet. Dorsey Lybrand found him on the driving range and insisted they "take a ride". He shared with Bob his "inside information" that 1900 acres on the southwest side of Hitchcock Woods were coming available for purchase.

E. F. Conger was a respected business man with Norfolk Creosoting Company. His land had been forested and donated to his alma mater, N.C. State University Department of Forestry. The university was more interested in the proceeds from a sale than owning the land. After Bob & Dorsey drove down the logging trails to take a look at the property, they met with a local banker who agreed to give them a loan to buy the land. The sale of 2 separate tracts closed in 1961.

Some people said Bob and Dorsey were "crazy fools to buy that worthless pulp wood land", but they had vision. At that time, the City of Aiken was limited to the historic district.

The separate 600+ acre tract between Kalmia Hill and Dibble Road was developed into residential lots, most of which became Westcliff. The Penlands built their family home there on Burgundy Road in 1962. By this time, they had a son, "Robbie". Peggy & Robbie had a wonderful childhood growing up in this neighborhood on a one-acre lot overlooking Hitchcock Woods.

Between 1961 & 1974 a lot of planning took place for development of the other larger tract of land - 1200+ acres. In the early 70's, Foxchase was developed (prior to the construction of the Hitchcock Parkway). Then came the development of 18 holes of golf, the annexation of land and subdivision of first sections of residential lots.

How did Houndslake get its name? Bob consulted with his wife, Amelia, and told her it needed to include the word, "lake" since there were 2 naturally, spring-fed lakes constructed on the golf course. Since Foxchase came first, Amelia said, "Well, wherever there's a fox, there's a hound, so how about "Houndslake"?

In search of a golf course architect, Bob Penland met with Mark McCormick, who represented Arnold Palmer and Jack Nicklaus. Penland's choice was Palmer, but Arnie was not available due to the construction of his own course at Bay Hill. McCormick recommended Joe Lee who designed La Costa, Doral & Disneyworld, and Penland agreed.

Due to the high cost of land, most developers plan the residential development first and the golf course

has to fit in afterwards. Here, Joe Lee had the freedom to locate the golf course where it needed to go and the lots were planned after the course was designed. It was the only time he was given a blank canvas for his creation. Joe later told Bob's son, Rob Penland, that Houndslake was his very favorite project! There were rave reviews from the press who played here first before the official opening in October of 1974.

Before the Club was built, Robert E. "Bob" Jones of Denver, Colorado came to Aiken for The Masters and the tournament was rained out. Bob Penland got a call from a local Realtor stating that Jones might want to make an investment. The two men formed a fast friendship and Bob Jones wanted to become a partner in the Houndslake venture. Dorsey Lybrand decided to sell his stock in the corporation to Bob Jones, who flew back and forth from Denver to check on the progress. He put his trust and confidence in Penland to make the day-to-day decisions and to handle the development. Houndslake Country Club opened in style the following year on April 4th of 1975.

The Seawell Family has exciting plans to commemorate the 50th Anniversary of Houndslake to include the Founders' Golf Ball and many other wonderful events throughout the year, so stay tuned!




